### Message from the Headteacher

Do not use excessive tissues while drying/wiping your hands. When you go for offering prayers please make sure you have done your ablution with due care and order.

**You** must not forget phoning your Group teachers for midweek reading/testing. If you are unable to contact for some genuine reasons, this is your moral duty to inform your teachers before your scheduled time. Jazakumullah. May Allah enable you all (Amen).
